Writing a Justification Letter

We're here to help you get support from your principal or administrator to attend CEC 2024 in San Antonio. You can customize this "justification letter" to make the case for your attendance.

Some things to remember to support your request...

- Emphasize impact. Attending CEC 2024 will benefit you as an educator, the students you serve, your colleagues, and ultimately your school. Talk about the new ideas and strategies you will discover that are based on solid research and academia.
- Highlight the savings. Your school or district can save money while investing in professional development for individual teachers or entire teams. Best Rate savings are in effect through October 26, 2023.
- Stress the connection. Make sure you explain how your attendance will help you meet the knowledge requirements of your school or state. You can earn up to 23 Continuing Education Units (CEUs) over four days.
- You can direct your own learning and design the program that meets your specific needs—and those of your school.
- Highlight the opportunity to learn firsthand by engaging directly with experts leading the Pre & Post-<u>Convention Workshops</u>. These experiences are a great way to enhance your professional development at the convention—please note that additional fees are required.
