Celebrating CEC Teacher of the Year

Theresa Copple

Special Education Teacher and Deaf and Hard of Hearing Itinerant Teacher
Riverside County Office of Education
Riverside, California

As a Deaf and Hard of Hearing Itinerant teacher who works for the Riverside County Office of Education, Theresa serves RCOE students and students within the Alvord Unified School district. Many of her students rely heavily on technology to experience an equitable education.

As a teacher-without-a-room, aka itinerant teacher, one of her biggest challenges is not having a place to teach. She has taught at picnic tables outside, inside closets, borrowed principal offices, teachers' lounge, and in the best place, the RSP room. She says collaborating with onsite RSP teachers is critical.



"My son's kindergarten teacher, Mrs. Severson, taught, 'Use your resources,' and my Dad instructed with these words of wisdom: 'Be like a sponge and soak it up,'" Theresa said in her nomination letter. "I hear their mantras in my head as I teach, and I pass on their words. It's connecting my teachers to my students through my instruction. It's all about being a coordinator."
